
# **OLD TESTAMENT CONNECTIONS**

With the quick growth of the world's population after the time of Noah, true faith again rapidly disappeared. Instead of spreading out over the earth according to God's command, the human race lived as a unit. This rebellion came to a head when they attempted through their unchecked idolatrous self-glorification to build a city and a tower (Babel). God confused their languages and forced them to spread out throughout the world. After some time God chose an individual, Abraham from the land of Ur (present day Iraq) and eventually one division of his numerous descendants, the Hebrews, would carry on the true religion and perpetuate the line of the coming Christ. At this point the rest of the Old Testament will concern itself primarily with the history of this lineage and will mention other peoples only as much as they interact with this specially chosen people of God. At age 75, Abraham was called to leave his home country and take up residence in the land of Canaan, given to him by God, although he resides there as a nomadic herdsman the rest of his days. God gave Abraham a threefold promise: his descendants would become a great nation, his name would become great and through his Seed, the coming Savior, all the nations would be blessed. When they waited a long time to have their first child, Abraham, at Sarah's urging, had a son through her handmaiden, Hagar. His name was Ishmael, but he was not the son of promise. "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No."

So they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said."

(Now they had been sent from the Pharisees.) They asked him, "Then why are you baptizing, if you are neither the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands One you do not know, even He who comes after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie." These things took place in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing. (ESV)
